

The Pool and Spa

The Quiet Water pool and spa was open June 15 through September 15. Judy Line, together with our Site Managers, Doug and Joan Johnson, made sure they were well maintained. Before the pool opened Doug, Joan and Judy attended a class held by Lincoln County for people who would be doing pool maintenance.

Judy did a wonderful job of overseeing the pool balance and keeping the pool area and restrooms clean. Doug and Joan suggest that if the pool is kept open until September 15 next year the closing time be no later than 6:00 p.m. With an 8:00 p.m. closing, it's very dark by the time the end-of-the-day pool maintenance is completed.

To close the pool for the season, all tubes and covers were treated with an anti-algae agent and scrubbed, and the filters were given an extra cleaning.

During the winter, Doug and Joan will be running the pumps, testing the chemicals, brushing water from the covers and trying to keep all debris out of the area so it will not blow under the covers.

The pool was inspected by Lincoln County both before it opened and after it closed. The County Inspector indicated that the books for tracking testing, results and adjustments were the best kept records he had ever seen!





(From the Board) **Boat Launch**



At the end of our annual June meeting, QW member Dennis Schuelke raised an important question about the appropriate spot to launch kayaks and canoes along QW's section of the river. This is important for a number of reasons, as it has become apparent that boats launched along many sections of the bank are causing damage to recent plantings. With the much larger number of expected plantings this Winter by Walama Restoration, it is important that we develop a policy that minimizes damage to new (and old) plantings.

After some discussion, the Board of Directors recommends that the Riverbend Area (where the river makes its 90 degree Westward turn to the ocean) be the sole launching spot for kayaks, canoes and other small craft. There are several reasons for this. First, this section of the river is---as Paul Haley described it---geologically active. That is, Winter storms are continually re-arranging this section of the river, often removing sand, but also creating new sandbars. Scars created by launching boats in this area in the Summer are often gone by the following Spring. Second, for at least the past 20 years, this area has always provided at least one safe, launching area for sliding boats off the sandbars into the water. As you may know, trying to get into a kayak or canoe off of a steep bank can be dangerous and often leads to capsizing. Third, there already is a well-worn trail from the river path to the sandbars, along which boats can be pulled.

By launching boats solely in this Riverbend Area, we hope to minimize damage to new plantings associated with Riparian Restoration. But apart from boat launchings, the QW community will have to be careful to protect new plantings from trampling along the bank. We welcome your suggestions as to the best way to keep QW members and visitors from inadvertently damaging new plantings.
